


2013 Character Camp

2013 Character Camp Required Information from Schools

Here's what you need to do before your day at Character Camp. To ensure a quick and efficient registration, kindly read all instructions and materials carefully.

1. Make sure all students fill out a health form and permission slip. The students will not be able to participate in any activities without these forms.
2. For the safety of your students, please return both forms (health form & permission slip) to Field Support Specialist at Christine.Rabideaux@Scouting.org or 330 South 84th Street, Milwaukee WI 53214 on or before April 26, 2013.
3. Keep a copy of the health form and permission slip for your records and bring with you the day of the event.
4. You are responsible for the transportation for your class/school. We have provided a map for your convenience. Kindly make sure you give the bus company the directions we provided. (**Important note: GPS directions may not take you to the correct location!**).
5. Recruit your chaperones early to guarantee you have **1 adult per 10 children**. NOTE: To ensure the safety of the students, it is the policy of the Learning for Life Program to have 1 adult per 10 children. The chaperones should be ready to guide and assist the students. ***It is the responsibility of the chaperones and teachers to supervise the students.***

Make Sure Your Students are prepared!!

1. Bag lunch is needed with drink (no glass items).
2. Wear comfortable clothing (play clothes, gym shoes).
3. Dress for the weather!!!

Please DO NOT bring personal belongings to camp (i.e. electronics, book bags, note books). The Three Harbors Council, Learning for Life program is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

Make sure you and your chaperones are ready to:

1. Take part in activities and help out when needed.
2. Supervise the behavior of your students.
3. Smile & have fun!

Please note: In order for Learning for Life to provide your students a quality program, we must let our Program Staff focus on running the program and activities. Any students that jeopardize the safety of others will be kept out of activities for the remainder of the day.

Inclement weather does not cancel Character Camp. Indoor programs will be provided.

2013 Character Camp Program Activities

Activities are subject to age appropriateness and may change at anytime.
Below are some activities but not limited to:

A. Alphabet Scavenger Hunt

Emphasizes the importance of teamwork, leadership, cooperation, collaborative effort, grace, compassion and listening.

B. Target Games

Emphasizes the importance of listening, respect, strategy, patience, trust and understanding.

C. Castle

Emphasizes the importance of discovery, curiosity and team spirit.

D. Five Man Ski Relay

Emphasizes the importance of team work, communication, leadership, public speaking, strategy, patience, cooperation, trust and collaborative effort.

E. Human Foosball

Emphasizes the importance of teamwork, listening, team spirit, patience, curiosity, discovery and strategy.

F. Land Row

Emphasizes the importance of cooperation, leadership, understanding, listening, respect, communication, trust, collaborative effort, team spirit and strategy.

G. Mine

Emphasizes the importance of listening, curiosity, discovery, grace and patience.

H. Ship

Emphasizes the importance of listening, patience, collaborative effort, strategy, trust, compassion, curiosity, discovery and grace.
