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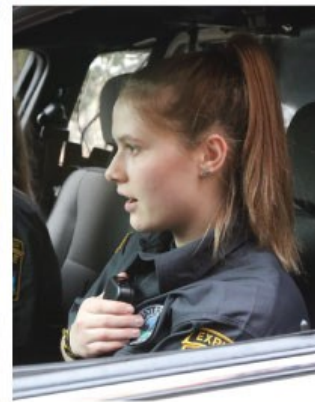

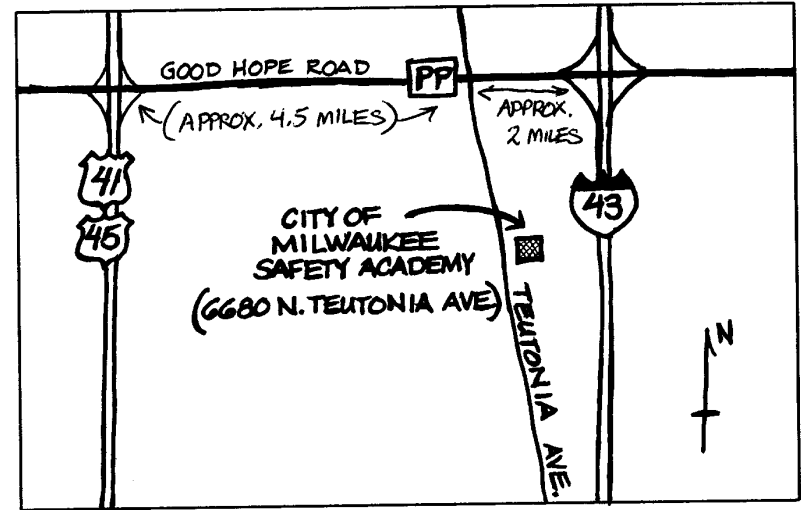

GENERAL RULES

No more than two teams per jurisdiction due to time constraints. A minimum of two (2) Explorers per team with a maximum of four (4) per team are required for participation. For the Traffic Stop, Disturbance Call, and MILO only two members from each team will be allowed to participate in the event. These two members will be scored for their team in these events. Note: Obstacle Course and Laser Tag are scored on all four team members' participation.

Duty belts are required for several events. Dummy guns are not required and will be provided.

Advisors, if authorized by their department, may carry firearms but will not be permitted to enter into any events with them. Secured lockers for storage will be provided.

Do not discuss any of the events/scenarios in public, as this may cause an unfair advantage to another Post. Doing so, may disqualify your Post from the competition.

Portions of this event will be outdoors. Please dress accordingly.

Some events, such as the Obstacle Course, are more physically demanding, and there may be limited time to change in and out of different uniforms during the event. Consider wearing utility type attire and appropriate footwear.

TEAM EVENTS

EVENT: Traffic Stop (2 Explorers per team) Outdoors.

Explorers will conduct a traffic stop. Some of the things Explorers will be scored on are verbalization, officer safety, teamwork, and decision making.

EVENT: Obstacle Course (4 Explorers per team) Team match indoors.

Explorers will negotiate a preset obstacle course. Course will be explained prior to event. Explorers will be graded on overall team (team of four) time.

EVENT: Disturbance Call (2 Explorers per team) Indoors.

Explorers will respond to a call of a disturbance at a residence. Contact with those subject(s) involved will be made and Explorers will establish what, if any, crime is present. The team will make a decision on what, if anything, will be done. Some of the things Explorers will be scored on are teamwork, verbalization, officer safety, and decision making.

EVENT: M.I.L.O. Multiple Interactive Learning Objectives (2 Explorers per team) Indoors.

Explorers will engage an interactive screen, use of force (shoot/don't shoot) simulator. Some of the things Explorers will be scored on are teamwork, verbalization, follow through considerations, movement and decision making.

EVENT: Laser Tag (4 Explorers per team) Team match - Indoors.

Explorers will be equipped with laser guns and targets and will have to try to tag the members of the opposing team. Explorers will be scored on how many tags per opposing team member in a specific time frame.
