

From Eagle Scout to Global Cross-Cultural Explorer

Chris "Bash" Bashinelli joins us to share stories of global travels from his hit series *Bridge the Gap* on the National Geographic Channel, his writings for Lonely Planet and his role in the U.N. International Day of Peace.

For socially conscious members of the modern world, Bash — the Cross-Cultural-Explorer — takes us on an introspective adventure, walking in the shoes of people halfway around the world and

encouraging us to think differently about our lives.

Bash's energy, humor and compassion have made him a renowned international speaker. At 24 years old he became the youngest man ever to moderate the U.N. International Day of Peace.

Bash is a United Nations Emcee, National Geographic Explorer, Eagle Scout and writer for awardwinning publications including Lonely Planet.

As an actor-turned-activist, Bash's mission in life is to create a "Culture of Compassion" while using media to bridge intercultural gaps worldwide. With humor and humility, Bash presents us with a new way of looking at our world.
