





CRIMINAL BACKGROUND RECHECK SUBMISSION

On October 7, the National BSA sent an email with background check disclosures and authorization documents to all currently registered adults who have a valid email address listed in their ScoutNET person profile.

The BSA is committed first and foremost to keeping youth safe. Part of that commitment includes continually updating our youth protection policies to help ensure we are always on the forefront of youth safety. Since 2003, background checks have been conducted on every new adult when they apply to register as a Scout leader.

Starting next year, the BSA will implement periodic rechecks of criminal backgrounds on a five-year basis with the first recheck taking place in January 2020. In preparation for this, the required disclosures and authorization documents are being updated to ensure compliance with current local, state, and federal laws.

In order to ensure that all authorization forms are collected in the most efficient way possible, we are asking that all adults submit your signed authorization form to the unit leader in charge of recharter for your unit. All authorizations should be submitted with your unit recharter when it is due.

Individuals not registered in a unit (council and/or district registrations, Merit Badge Counselors, etc.) should submit their updated authorization forms directly to the council through the council/district renewal process. We will maintain a file for all authorization forms submitted individually. If, as a unit leader processing your unit recharter, you need to know which of your leaders has submitted their authorization form directly to the council, please contact your District Executive or Program Services for that list of individuals.

It is strongly recommended that leaders with multiple registrations provide an authorization to each unit in which they are registered (including any council and/or district registrations you may hold). This can be a copy of one signed original or separate forms with original signatures. This process will prevent a lag in registration with one unit while waiting on another to turn in your authorization form.

For those leaders that did not receive this email, the forms are available on the council website, at Roundtables and other meetings of the district and at the Council Service Centers. Should you have any questions about the new Criminal Background Rechecks and/or the process to submit those, please contact your district professional staff.



The committee is hard at work to keep Camp Oh-Da-Ko-Ta an exciting destination for today's youth and families. For it's 90th birthday this year, a master plan is in the works to upgrade areas of camp to current standards:

- Camp entrance storage added to get all equipment covered
- · Directional signs to help visitors find their way
- Renovations to Carl Johnson cabin and the camp store
- · A new ceremonial fire bowl, seating and lighting

Additional improvements include: enhancing shooting sports area, fixing picnic tables, infrastructure electrical and plumbing, maintenance shed prep work, widening the road, and general camp clean-up.

NEW EAGLE SCOUT PATIO

The trail to Eagle is a long and hard which leaves a lasting imprint on your life. Do the same at camp by becoming a part of history and engraving your name on a brick making it part of the Eagle Patio.

Parents, grandparents, troops, and friends, this is a great gift to honor your new Eagle Scout, a gift that will last a lifetime.

Orders take 4-6 weeks, but with enough notice, you can display the brick at your Eagle Court of Honor prior to being placed in the patio.

Start a Troop tradition, get a brick for each Eagle Scout in the troop and display your troop honor roll at camp!

A little camp history - The original section of camp property was donated by Charles Nash in 1929. Newspaper coverage of the day reported that it "is considered one of the most complete and ideal in the middle west and exceeding any organized camp established by Boy Scouts in the state of Wisconsin. One of the features at the camp is the quarter-mile waterfront on the lake."


A 1932 article describes the original 73-acre camp as having three sections: a regular Scout camp, an Indian camp with six 16-foot teepees and a Pioneer Unit with five log lean-tos. By 1948, a shooting sports range was established at camp, a bird sanctuary was created, and an advanced first aid training program was begun.
