Support Scouting while driving with a Wisconsin Scouting license plate. Choose the Scouting fleur de lis for Scouting Alumni or the Eagle emblem for Eagle Scouts.





SCOUTING ALUMNI LICENSE PLATES

Any Wisconsin resident may apply for Scouting Alumni license plates. Individual decals are available for Boy Scout or Eagle Scout. The plate fees include an issuance fee of \$15 plus an annual \$25 tax-deductible contribution in addition to the regular registration fee. These contributions go to the non-profit Boy Scouts of America National Foundation and are distributed to local Wisconsin councils.

Vehicles that qualify

- automobiles
- motor homes (annual registration only)
- motor trucks 4,500, 6,000 or 8,000 pounds gross weight including dual purpose farm and dual purpose vehicle
- motor trucks 12,000 pounds gross weight farm truck

Things you should know

When you request Scouting Alumni license plates, you pay:

- \$25 annual donation. The donation may be deductible if you itemize your income tax returns.
- \$15 issuance fee or an annual \$15 personalized plate fee, if requested.
- The regular registration fee for your vehicle if your current plates expire within three months or you have no plates.
- At each plate renewal, you will pay the \$25 donation and the regular registration fee for non-personalized Scouting Alumni plates.

How to apply

Local DMV customer service centers do not have Scouting Alumni license plates for immediate issue, but can process applications and the plates will be mailed. Temporary plates will be issued, if needed.

To apply for Scouting Alumni license plates by mail, please send the following items:

1. If the vehicle you wish to register with Scouting Alumni license plates is already titled in your name, send:

- A copy of your Certificate of Registration or show the complete vehicle description on the MV2991 Scouting Alumni License Plate Information and Application (download online)
- Select Boy Scout or Eagle Scout style
- \$25 Scouting Alumni donation
- \$15 issuance fee or \$15 personalized plate fee
- The annual registration fee if the current plates expire within the next three months or you have no plates
- 2. If the vehicle is not titled in your name, send:
 - A completed Wisconsin Title & License Plate Application MV1, or MV11 for dealer sales, including all fees (download online)
 - A completed MV2991 Scouting Alumni License Plate Information and Application (download online)
 - Select Boy Scout or Eagle Scout style
 - The Certificate of Title assigned to you by the seller
 - \$25 Scouting Alumni donation
 - \$15 issuance fee or \$15 personalized plate fee

...be clear. Be sure to use official BSA marks and logos from the <u>BSA Brand</u> <u>Center</u> when using terms like "Scout Me In" whether in print, social media, or digital.



Remember...

...girls who are in Scouts BSA aren't members of the Girl Scouts of the USA (GSUSA). Avoid using the word "girl" before "Scouts." This includes fliers, in conversation, social media, etc. For example, you shouldn't say, "Let's have that group of Scouts BSA girl Scouts line up."

Do....

...remember that the BSA and GSUSA are separate organizations. If those around you say or suggest otherwise, politely correct them!

Don't....

...use names, programs, marks, logos, images, or awards of the GSUSA or combine them with those of the BSA.

Dear Scoutmaster,

We are once again pleased to host the annual On to Eagle Cub Scout to Scouts BSA transition event. With all the changes happening within Scouting, now is the time to showcase why your unit is the one new Arrow of Light Scouts should crossover to. This event will help Cub Scouts (Webelos & AOL) make decisions on whether to continue to advance into Scouts BSA. With the addition of females into all aspects of Scouting, we want to encourage as many Scouts as possible to continue with the traditions of Scouting.

As we continue to grow, we are encouraging each unit to invite Webelos & Arrow of Light Scouts as part of their troop for this Cub Scout to Scout BSA transition. One of the highlights of the weekend for the Webelos & Arrow of Light Scouts will be their participation in the Adventure Trail on Saturday.

The theme this year is **Scouting Adventures**. Every troop's campsite will serve as a station on the trail. Your troop should plan one or more Adventurous Scouting skills that will involve all youth; especially the Cub Scouts in a hands-on experience. Plan your skill to last a minimum of 15 minutes. Each unit will choose a Scouting skill to showcase and base the skills around one of the Adventures of Scouting – keep in mind this can also include high adventure prep and information. What an amazing way to showcase your unit and demonstrate what makes it different from its neighbor.

To eliminate duplication, please complete and return the enclosed form with your skills. You may wish to pick a section from the Boy Scout handbook and build your session around that. Please plan to bring a bead representing your Scouting skill that can be added to each Scout's lanyard as they visit your site.

Arrow of Light Scouts who have not yet committed to a troop, as well as those who may have already graduated into a troop, are encouraged to attend. Fourth through sixth grade non-Scouts are also invited to attend and enjoy Scouting at its best! You may know some other youth who may be interested, so please extend the invitation.

We encourage you to register your unit early – either online or via paper copy by Saturday, April 13th to enjoy the \$10 price. After April 13th there will be a \$10 late fee. The Cub Scouts and any adults that will be participating with them have been notified that they should register through a host troop. You will be their host for meals and should charge the Scouts and adults accordingly for food costs.

Given we are at a council camp, we have the necessary equipment you would expect, fire bowls (some raised or stand-alone), water, restrooms, etc. You may also wish to bring a table and any additional equipment your unit may need to enjoy the weekend. As always, there will be an award for the ideal On to Eagle troop. The campsite inspection checklist that will be used is an important part of the award criteria. The inspectors will be coming around on Saturday to inspect sites.

We need your positive attitude and Scouting spirit to see that 100% of all Cub Scouts attending this event go into Scouting!
