

## Red Arrow Unit Commissioner Position Description

Objective:

To help units succeed with a good program that attracts and retains youth members. The unit commissioner connects the resources of the district and council to the units they serve and is a Scouting generalist whose passionate overriding mission in Scouting is to help units succeed by helping each unit he/she serves to achieve Journey to Excellence Gold Level for the unit.

## Responsibilities:

- ✓ Help each unit achieve the Journey to Excellence recognition.
- ✓ Use the monthly commissioner service plan; maintain its scheduled opportunities for commissioner contact with units.
- ✓ Know each phase of the Scouting program and be able to describe what each is and how each works. Review all Scouting program literature to support assigned units.
- ✓ See that all direct-contact unit leadership completes basic leader training, including Youth Protection training.
- ✓ Visit unit meetings, including committee meetings and unit activities, regularly. Record all contacts using Commissioner Tools. Contact each assigned unit Key 3 face-to-face or by email, telephone, or other means at least monthly. Complete at least two detailed assessments for each unit each year.
- ✓ Keep in touch with the chartered organizations of the units you serve so they become and stay engaged in Scouting and know you as a resource to their needs. Record your visits in Commissioner Tools.
- ✓ Know the neighborhood in which your units are located so you can help unit leaders know more about the community and other Scouting resources around them.
- ✓ Know the district and council in order to provide volunteer and professional subject matter experts to help the unit.
- ✓ Set the example. Keep your promises. Be helpful. Be diplomatic. Wear the correct uniform. Model Scouting ideals.
- ✓ Continue to increase your skills as a commissioner through training, experience, and consultation with others in the district. Complete Commissioner Basic Training; attend the College of Commissioner Science.
- ✓ Be sure that unit adults attend Cub Scout, Scouts BSA and Venturing roundtables.
- ✓ Make certain that proper techniques are used to select and recruit unit leadership.
- ✓ Help the unit conduct a membership inventory (at least annually) of youth and adults.
- ✓ Facilitate the on-time annual charter renewal of all assigned units using Internet rechartering. Present the new charter at an appropriate meeting of the chartered organization.
- ✓ Encourage assigned units to complete and turn-in their JTE report with their charter renewal.
- ✓ Support and promote local and national Scouting policy, procedures, and practices.
- ✓ Recognize individuals, committees, and chartered organizations for their Scouting accomplishments.
- ✓ Participate in the Friends of Scouting Campaign as a leadership donor.
